These families are homeless, usually for the first time. Their home while in the program is a different church each week. During the day Family Promise works with the families to find jobs, housing and whatever support they need to get back on an even keel. Volunteers are needed to fill a number of tasks from the setting up and disassembling the home rooms on Sundays or preparing and serving dinner, socializing with family members by helping with homework or playing games, to laundering bedding and towels, or sleeping over at the home church with the guests in case of an emergency. - More than a third of adults over age 65 fall each year
