TODAYS READINGS

First Reading: Isaiah 66:18-21

Isaiah portrays a time when people from many nations will gather in Jerusalem and proclaim God's glory. God's messengers will teach many nations about God. Just as the Israelites bring offerings, these messengers will bring people from all nations to worship.

Second Reading: Hebrews 12:5-7, 11-13

The Hebrews are told that God disciplines those he loves. When a parent disciplines a child, the child usually learns what is expected of him. The Hebrews are encouraged to face life's trials as a form of discipline, and attempt to learn something from them.

Gospel: Luke 13:22-30

Jesus warns that the door to God's kingdom will be locked for those who ignored his wishes. Many people will come from all nations and take their place in God's kingdom. Others will not be recognized by God, and he will reject them.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION NEWS:

Diocesan Policy states that two years of preparation are required before celebration of the sacraments of First Penance and First Eucharist.

If you have a child entering First Grade and they will not be attending a parochial school they should be registered in a Religious Education Program. Thus, all students entering First Grade in September 2022 should register in a program. Please call the Parish Office (610.777.1697) to request a registration form. **Deadline to register is August 29, 2022.** Our Program serves children from First Grade – Eighth Grade. Classes are held on Sunday evenings from 6:00 pm – 7:15 pm.

R.C.I.A. Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults.

The R.C.I.A. is the way in which people explore the possibility of joining the Catholic Christian Community. It's a process of informal instruction, prayer and sharing – that leads to full membership in the Catholic Church.

Who is this for? Anyone who has never been baptized, those of another faith, those who have no affiliation with any church, or Catholics who have never completed full initiation (celebration of the sacraments of Confirmation and Holy Eucharist.)
