A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

On Sunday June 19, 2022, the Solemnity of Corpus Christi (The Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus) the Catholic Church in the United States began a 3-year Eucharistic Revival. A WORD FROM OUR PARISH NURSES MINISTRY

Is it Depression or Dementia?

As we and those around us age, it is natural and common for a person to not be as sharp as they once were. Often, these changes are attributed to aging and are frequently assumed to be dementia. Dementia is a broad term used when describing declines in intellectual functioning. However, along with dementia, depression is also common in older adults and often will share many of the same features. It can be easy to assume a person is getting dementia when actually, they are depressed.

Here are some common signs of depression and how they may differ from dementia. These signs may include decreased interest in activities that were once enjoyed and the slowing of responses. When a person is depressed, slowness often comes with a lack of interest in doing things. The person will withdraw from people and activities they once had. If depressed, a person may not show any interest in conversing, and when asked a question, they may respond by stating "I don't know" rather than trying to answer. Often this decline will happen quickly and will be noticeable right away.

When a person has slowness due to dementia, they will typically still attempt to participate in conversation and activities, but the decline in functioning will happen slowly. If a person has memory issues, they may still try to answer the questions and engage in conversation. At times they may make things up to fill in for memory gaps as dementia will often come with decreases in concentration and memory.

A decrease in concentration may also signify depression. Not being able to complete a task or stay on task can indicate depression. If a person with depression has memory issues, they will typically be aware of the memory loss, whereas those with dementia will have difficulty with short-term memory and may not notice the decline.
