

A WORD FROM OUR PARISH NURSES MINISTRY

Obstructive Sleep Apnea (OSA) is a common disease affecting between 18-22 million people. OSA consists of 2 types. Obstructive which is the result of the muscles in the throat relaxing and preventing the flow of air past the back of throat and Central which involves a miscommunication between the brain and muscles of the throat. Central Sleep Apnea occurs in less than 1% of all OSA cases.

Signs of OSA include: Daytime sleepiness, morning headache, dry mouth, snoring and restless sleep. Some risk factors for OSA include: male gender, large tongue, short, lower jaw, and thick short neck. Complications of OSA can result in hypertension, atrial fibrillation of the heart, mental fog, and accidents due to lack of sleep.

OSA is diagnosed through a sleep study termed polysomnogram. This an overnight sleep test in a sleep lab that monitors number and length of time a person stops breathing and their oxygen levels during the night. The diagnosis is made as no OSA, mild OSA 5-14 episodes of lack of breathing for 20-30 seconds, moderate 15-29 episodes and severe 30 or more episodes.

Treatments for OSA include BiPAP/CPAP, mouth piece and Inspira. The mouthpiece is provided usually by a dentist and holds the jaw/tongue in place to allow the air to flow freely past the throat. A BiPAP /CPAP device fits over nose or mouth tightly and delivers a determined amount of positive pressure to keep the airway open. Inspira was FDA approved in 2014 for use with OSA patients who meet criteria. The basic criteria are failed BiPAP/CPAP, minimum age 18 years, diagnosis of moderate to severe OSA and no CSA.

Inspira is an implant that delivers a gentle impulse to the hypoglossal nerve on the bottom of the tongue that results in the movement of the tongue to allow air flow past it. Placement on an Inspira is done by qualified physicians (ENT or OSA physicians with training). The procedure is done as an outpatient and lasts about 90 minutes. It involves placing an impulse generator (a small device 3inches) beneath the clavicle and the stimulation lead (a small wire) is tunneled from the generator to the base of the tongue (hypoglossal nerve site) The sensory lead at the generator site senses the lack of breathing and sends a signal to the stimulation lead which then send signal to hypoglossal nerve which causes the tongue to move so that air can pass. There is an external device that the patient uses to turn the Inspira on and off. This is done by placing the device over the site of the impulse generator. The most common complaints include: tongue pain, headache, dry mouth and feeling the stimulation. There is a 94 % success rate associated with the use of Inspira.

MARCH NOVENA

Over the last few months Pope Francis has been physically ill, but his spirit has remained high. This Novea will be to pray for him and the cardinals as the move on the many issues that were brought to the forefront during the synod. Not all was agreed upon by all, so we must pray for the unification of the cardinals in the months to come. This Novena will begin on 3/17 and end nine days later.

Opening prayer

Almighty God, look kindly on your servant Pope Francis. You invited him to shepherd Your flock. Guide him and protect him in his daily work. Inspire him in Your ways to keep your people uplifted. Give him the strength to recover in health and assist him in spreading your Gospel throughout the world.

Pray the rosary of the day.

The Closing Prayer

O Jesus eternal priest, keep your cardinals within the shelter of your Sacred Heart where none may touch them. Keep unstained their anointed hands which daily touch your Sacred Body. Keep unsullied their lips daily purpled with your Precious Blood. Keep pure and unearthly their hearts sealed with the sublime mark of the priesthood. Unite them to help Pope Francis in his mission in guiding the church through troubled times. Bless them in their daily lives with Your Grace. Amen
