TODAYS READINGS

First Reading: Isaiah 50:4-7

Isaiah describes the pain and insults of the Servant of God. Yet he sounds hopeful when describing God as his help, knowing he will not be disgraced.

Second Reading: Philippians 2:6-11

Paul exults Christ's great sacrifice of humbling himself to become human and die on the cross. He explains that this is why we should now realize the importance of honoring both his name and memory.

Gospel: Mark 14:1-15:47

Mark describes the events leading up to Christ's crucifixion. The Last Supper is described, explaining where the Eucharist began. Judas betrays Jesus and his suffering at the hands of the Sanhedrin (Council) is detailed.

What does it mean to be a Knight?

Michael Joseph McGivney was the first of 12 children born into an Irish immigrant's home in Westbury CT. Michael left school at 13 to work alongside his father and help support the family. At 16 he decided to enter the seminary in Quebec Canada until he was called home to again support the family upon the death of his father. Michael eventually returned to his studies at St. Mary's seminary in Baltimore and was ordained into the diocese of Hartford CT. in 1877.

His first assignment was St. Mary's in Hartford where he became quite active in the community. He volunteered to foster a child whose father has passed away just like his own circumstance. It was this experience that gave him the vision where Catholic men could provide financial security to families in need. At that time in the U.S. Catholics were often discriminated against and denied entrance into labor unions where the better paying jobs could be secured. He then started a committee of men in his home parish. He also designed a fraternal financial program so Catholics could help other Catholic families in need. On February 6, 1882, Father McGivney and his men launched the Knights of Columbus whose principles were charity, unity, fraternity, and patriotism. The Knights grew rapidly and today there are over 16,000 parish councils with a worldwide membership of 2,000,000 men who volunteer millions of hours doing charitable works for those in need in addition to raising funds for a wide variety of organizations and causes. Locally we support Lifeline, The Kennedy House soup kitchen, March for Life, programs at La Salle academy, Mary's shelter, Berks Catholic sports, The John Paul II center, as well as our own parish.

What does it mean to be a Knight?

It means a life of faith in action, a life of boldness in brotherhood, a life worth living. Join 2 million Catholic men on a mission.

In 2008 Father McGivney was beatified by Pope Benedict. His insights have brought comfort to thousands and thousands over the years and with God grace countless thousands will be served in the future.

Blessed Michael McGivney Apostle to the young, Protector of Christian Family Life and Founder of the Knights of Columbus intercede for us.
